## The Centre of Polish Language and Culture for Foreigners 'Polonicum' offers:

- Polish language classes at all levels of proficiency, from A1 (beginner) to C2 (proficiency);
- Lectures, seminars, workshops, films, audio-visual presentations introducing Polish history, culture and traditions (in both Polish and English);
- Ethnographic workshops (organised in co-operation with the Ethnographic Museum of Warsaw) related to specific customs (St. Andrew's Day, Christmas and Easter);
- State Certificate Examinations in Polish as a foreign language.

International students of the University of Warsaw are eligible for a number of teaching hours of Polish language and culture for free. The number varies for exchange and degree students, as well as for 1<sup>st</sup> cycle, 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle and PhD students. For details, please contact your faculty.

# LEARNING FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Students of the University of Warsaw may learn more than 40 different languages. The University System of Language Provision was distinguished by the European Union with the European Language Label of the Labels award – a European recognition of innovative approaches in language teaching and learning. The language offer of the University of Warsaw is open not only to students, but also to non-students, including foreigners.

Students of the 1<sup>st</sup> cycle and long-cycle (5-year) studies at the University of Warsaw are eligible for 240 teaching hours for free.

Students of the University of Warsaw and prospective participants from outside UW can also take part in any number of fee-paying courses, be they face-to-face, blended or online.
